

# 2023 North Halton Showcase – September 8-10, 2023

## North Halton, Ontario Rules and Divisional Setup



- 1) The tournament will run during the following times:

Friday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023: 8am-11:30 pm

Saturday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023: 8am-11:30 pm

Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023: 8am-5pm

- 2) All Hockey Canada and OWHA rules apply unless otherwise noted in this document.
- 3) Team representatives must check in through the RAMP Gamesheets app prior to each of their games. OWHA teams may be requested to present a copy of their OWHA registration at any time for the duration of the tournament. Non-Ontario based teams must have a copy of their travel permit/sanction permit from their home hockey governing body prior to the start of the tournament. These requirements will be strictly enforced, as this is an OWHA sanctioned tournament.
- 4) **Teams must be available to play up to fifteen (15) minutes prior to regular scheduled game times.**
- 5) **Game times:** All round robin games will consist of three 15-minute stop time periods. The last ten minutes of the third period will be running time when there is a five-goal difference or more. Timing will revert to stop time if the difference is reduced to less than five goals.
- 6) **Timeouts:** No timeouts are allowed in round robin and consolation games. 1 x 30 second timeout is allowed for each team in each playoff game.
- 7) **Flooding Schedules:** Flooding will take place every two periods. This means that half the games will start on fresh ice (with a flood after the 2<sup>nd</sup> period) and half will begin on rough ice (with a flood after the first period). The tournament committee reserves the right to adjust the flood schedule if games start to run more than 15 minutes behind schedule.
- 8) **Overtime:** There will be no overtime in the round robin games. Ties in the round robin will be recorded as such in the standings. In the event of a tie in the play-off games there will be overtime to decide the winner. Overtime will be sudden death of **five minutes** 3 on 3 skaters plus a goalie. If after overtime the game remains tied, the tie will be broken via a shootout.  
  
In the case of penalties during overtime, no team shall go down to less than 3 skaters and the non-penalized team will add a player if required (3 on 3 becomes 4 on 3) until the first stoppage in play after the penalty has been served.
- 9) **Shootouts:** Shootouts to break a tie in the final start with a 3-player shootout. One player from each team will start at centre ice and skate in on the opposing goalie. Shootout on each goalie will take place simultaneously. If the game remains tied after three shooters, the shootout becomes sudden death. Shooters cannot repeat until all skaters of a team have taken a shootout attempt. Any player serving a penalty that has not expired by the end of overtime play may not participate in the shootout.
- 10) Minor penalties will be two (2) minutes. Penalties that are being served at the end of the third period will continue until completion during overtime if applicable.

- 11) OWHAs minimum suspensions **will be enforced**. Each team is responsible to report any suspensions incurred during the tournament to their OWHAs Rep or hockey governing body. Clearance from both the OWHAs and tournament discipline official is required before any suspended player can return to action. Any player serving a suspension must be clearly marked on the game sheet.
- 12) No body-checking in any division.
- 13) The center redline will only be in effect for icing infractions. (No center red line for 2 line passes).
- 14) **General Playoff Rules:** The play-off brackets for all divisions will be seeded based on rankings after the 3 or 4-game round robin (depending on team counts). All teams are guaranteed 4 games. If you are in a 3-game round robin division, you will play your 4<sup>th</sup> game as either a playoff game or consolation depending on your team's ranking. Roughly 50% of teams will advance to the playoffs.
- 15) **Divisional Formats:** Final division formats are pending until a final team count is secured. The tournament will be open to hosting the following divisions:
  - **U13 AA:** The U13 AA division will consist of 5 teams. Teams will play a 4-game round robin. The top 3 teams will advance to the playoffs. The 1<sup>st</sup> placed team will receive a bye to the finals.
  - **U13 A:** The U13 A division will consist of 8 teams split into 2 pool of 4 teams. Teams will play a 3-game round robin. The top 2 teams from each pool will advance to the playoffs. The bottom 2 teams from each pool will play their 4<sup>th</sup> game as a consolation.
  - **U15 AA:** The U15 AA division will consist of 4 teams. Teams will play a 3-game round robin. All 4 teams will advance to the playoffs.
  - **U15 A:** The U15 A division will consist of 8 teams split into 2 pool of 4 teams. Teams will play a 3-game round robin. The top 2 teams from each pool will advance to the playoffs. The bottom 2 teams from each pool will play their 4<sup>th</sup> game as a consolation.
  - **U18 A:** The U18 A division will consist of 14 teams. Teams will play a 3-game round robin. The top 8 teams will advance to the playoffs. The bottom 6 teams will play their 4<sup>th</sup> game as a consolation.
  - **U18 BB:** The U18 BB division will consist of 5 teams. Teams will play a 4-game round robin. The top 3 teams will advance to the playoffs. The 1<sup>st</sup> placed team will receive a bye to the finals.
  - **U18 B:** The U18 B division will consist of 4 teams. Teams will play a 3-game round robin. All 4 teams will advance to the playoffs.
- 16) Two (2) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) point for a tie.  
**There will be no overtime during round robin games or consolation games.**

17) **Tie Breaker Rules:**

The following criteria will be used to break any ties between teams upon the completion of the round robin:

- A) Number of wins
- B) Best Record against other teams in the tie (points only)
- C) Goals for minus goals against (Plus / Minus )
- D) Goals for divided by goals for and goals against (GF) / (GF+GA)
- E) Least goals against
- F) Least penalty minutes
- G) Coin Toss

\*\*\* We will continue to follow the tie-breakers downwards when teams are eliminated.
