The EDI initiative, which has been named UNITEAM, was first introduced to the attendees of the 2024 Canadians Nationals in Montreal, Quebec. In this tournament, 9 men's teams and 9 women's teams participated in the senior category. The participating men's teams were: Celtique 1, HCT 1, Laval, Lévis, Rosemont, Avengers, Champlain, HCT 2, and Celtique 2. The participating women's teams were: Celtique, Drummondville, Laval, New York, Champlain, Sherbrooke, Granby, HCT, and Rosemont.

A noteworthy aspect of this tournament was the evaluation of the host's facilities before the start of the competition and the presence of IHF and EHF referees, which significantly improved the quality of the games.

Additionally, two new refereeing talents were discovered: Teodora Bosonea and Keira Hopkinson from Alberta.

National Teams

We had a great start for 2024 with our National Team programs. A huge thanks to our volunteer National Team coaches for their commitment and passion and the huge amount of work that it takes to develop a national team. Highlights over the last 6 months include:

Senior Women



After a half-year break for the senior women's national team following the last 4-year cycle, the new cycle resumes with 45 athletes registered for the national camp in August. The goal is to select the best team to represent Canada at the 2025 World Qualifier.

We'd like to pay tribute to the athletes who retired at the end of the last cycle and who proudly represented Canada for over 12 years! Their commitment and perseverance have been exemplary and have been role models for the younger generations to come. A huge thank you to Myriam Laplante, Audrey Marcoux, Emily Routhier, Nassima Benhacine, Katya Chan, Marie-Pier Beaudry, Rosali Langlois and Samatha Koosau!

Senior Men

Under the new direction of Christian Latulippe, Remi Montesalvo and Josh Sickler, the Senior Men's National Team had a preparation camp in March in Gonfreville, France. 14 players participated in this camp, where they played 3 games, losing one to the N1 team of Gonfreville, and winning the against the N3 of Gronfreville and the N2 of Roissy-en-France. We would like to extend our deepest gratitude to the Gonfreville National Team organization for their support in helping train our Senior men, and we look forward to working with you in the near future!



Following the Gronfreville camp, the coaches selected 14 players to participate in the North American and Caribbean Handball Championship qualifier for the 2025 World Championship. At this event, we were competitive, holding teams like the USA and Greenland for 40 minutes and almost beating Mexico who finished in 3rd place. The team won their last match against Puerto Rico for the 5th place. Cuba won the tournament and qualify for the World Championship.

Finally in June, the Senior Men's Team organized a National Team Camp in Laprairie, Québec with the objective of evaluating new players. 25 players participated in this 9-day camp where the intensity and team spirit was very high. Team Canada is working hard to improve their ranking in upcoming international competitions.

The team plans to regroup for a training camp during the international week break in November in Greece. Then in 2025, the team will travel to France in January and in then to Guadeloupe in March.

U18 Women



The Canadian Juvenile Women's Handball Team are in the final stage of their preparations for the World Handball Championship in China! The tournament will be held from August 14 to 26, 2024.

The team will be in closed camp from July 26 to August 3 in Drummondville, Quebec; this period will be devoted to intensive training, weight training and team-building activities. The goal for this camp will be to fine-tune their strategies, improve their cohesion and achieve optimum physical conditioning for the competition.

On August 3, the team will fly to South Korea for a period of acclimatization and final preparation. They will also play friendly matches against local teams to test their performance and adapt to playing conditions in Asia. This stage will also be an opportunity to discover Korean culture and strengthen bonds between team members.

The team looks forward to competing with the best teams in the world and demonstrating the talent and determination of our young athletes.

The team has managed to raise \$140,000, which will be used to cover the costs of travel, accommodation and participation in the championship. However, they are still \$10,000 short of their goal and continue to seek donations from partners and supporters.

CTHF, along with all team members, and coaches would like to thank everyone who has supported the team so far, including families, friends, partners and supporters. Your encouragement and generosity are essential to our success, and we invite you to continue to follow our progress and support during the World Championship.

U18 Men

Selections for the U18 men's team (born 2006 to 2007) took place over spring of 2023, either during games at the Quebec juvenile circuit in Laval and Montreal, at the Team Quebec camp at École Dalbé-Viau, or at the Easter International Tournament in Levis. The first training camp was held in Drummondville over 3 days from September 2 to September 4, 2023, where 48 players were registered, 44 from Quebec and 4 from Alberta. The goal of the camp was to evaluate and identify players likely to continue training with Team Canada. Overall, 33 players were selected: 29 from Quebec, including 1 injured, and 4 from Alberta.

A total of 14 players will be selected for the upcoming IHF tournament in the autumn of 2024. The next training camps will take place in August 2024 in the Montreal and Drummondville regions.

Women's Beach Handball



This year has been one of exciting new growth for the Canadian Women's Beach National Handball team. With a new head coach at the helm, the team traveled to Puerto Rico in April to compete in the North American and Caribbean Handball Championship. Being that the program is in its primary development stages, the women's team saw tremendous improvement playing against much more seasoned teams (many of whom train professionally yearround); and were able to finish within the top 5 overall standings. Training continues with the team through the following scheduled events:

- Training camp in Alberta: June 28-29, 2024
- Tournament in Sylvan Lake, Alberta: July 27-28, 2024
- Tournament in Huntington Beach, California: August 23-25, 2024

Recruitment of players is ongoing (especially at the U16 level) as there are many international opportunities for these players. Interested players can contact Khalil El Haddaoui at k.elhaddaoui@handballcanada.ca.

Men's Beach Handball



The past 6 months have been busy with the final selections and fine tuning of the progress the men's team has accomplished over the past 2 years. January and February each had an indoor selection and training camp with over 30 participants from across the country at the Beach YYC, their winter training center. During these camps, national standards were established in various jumping, speed and agility tests, all measured on consistent sand conditions.

Preparations for the 2024 NACHC Continental Championship took the Canadian men to Brazil for 8 days. There our skills and knowledge grew exponentially through training sessions with top Brazilian coaches, games against several top clubs and a two game exhibition series with the Brazilian national team.

The 2024 NACHC Championships produced the best Canadian Men's results ever, moving from being unranked 3 years ago, to 6th place on the continent 2 years ago, and now officially breaking into the top 4 this year. Highlights include a shootout victory over 2nd ranked Mexico and a heartbreaking shootout loss to the hosts, Puerto Rico. USA and Puerto Rico went on to the World Championships on both the men's and women's side.

Those events marked the end of the 2022-2024 competition cycle. But preparations for the 2024-2026 cycle have already begun! At this time Beach Handball Canada are in a countrywide recruitment and development stage, hoping many clubs and provinces begin a U16 program (birthyear of

2008, 2009, & 2010) for grassroots development targeting continental championships this upcoming winter, the U17 World Championships in 2025, and the U18 Youth Olympics in 2026.

Lastly, the FISU's World University Championships are on the summer horizon for 18-25 years old athletes in university programs. The men's and women's teams are still looking for 6 athletes to join, train, and travel with them.
